

The Problem with RSE

1. Too graphic: Teaching material is graphic and parents are concerned about this being shown to their children. Images of nudity and details about sexual activity are present in teaching materials.
2. Too young: RSE will be taught to children as young as four. Parents question how children of this age can understand such concepts at such an early age, or why they should.
3. Unbalanced: How much emphasis will your school place on the hazards of sexual activity outside a traditional, committed marriage?
4. Hidden agenda: The RSE programme has been used by well funded, ideological rights groups, who do not represent mainstream, socially conservative society. Materials used and experiences of parents confirm this. Such groups (the School of Sexuality Education is just one) can pop up in schools as trainers or 'facilitators' and teach children with no warning to parents.
5. State control: In the past the state recognised its limits and did not try to force ideology on parents and children. RSE changes that, being strongly ideological and presented to parents as binding and unarguable.
6. No opt out for parents: In the past concerned parents were given the right to opt their children out of sex-ed lessons. For secondary pupils this was repealed in 2019. For primary children it only applies to the sex education part of RSE lessons. But the 'R' part is just as ideological, and parents may only request an opt-out from the 'S'. That's a 'right' - to ask permission?

In Wales the opt-out right has now completely gone. The fear for parents is that this will be followed in England – with little or no debate.

The result of years of sex education

We are forced to have a graphic, unbalanced, parent-unfriendly, anti-traditional family, sex-ed agenda forced upon us.

And the outcomes are shocking. After years of ever more explicit sex education, why do we have the highest levels of teenage pregnancies in Europe, the worst levels of STI's ever, suicide and soaring child on child sex abuse?

Under-emphasis on the importance of parents giving intimate details of sexuality in the home.

Under-emphasis of the value of faith teachings on sexual ethics.

Under-emphasis of damaging consequences of sexual behaviour outside heterosexual marriage.

Under-emphasis on genuine child protection which safe, non-RSE teaching would achieve.

Under-emphasis on trusting parents, removing their God given right to educate their children according to their values:

Human Rights Act 1998. Protocol 1, Article 2: Right to education:

'In the exercise of any functions which it assumes in relation to education and to teaching, the State shall respect the right of parents to ensure such education and teaching is in conformity with their own religious and philosophical convictions.'

Compulsory sex education, now called Relationships and Sex Education in UK nations, was imposed upon families in England by the UK Parliament in 2019 with the RSE regulations.
